## St. John Climacus

St. John Climacus was a monk at St. Catherine's Monastery at the bottom of Mount Sinai. He became a novice at age 16, and by the time he died, he had become the abbot of St. Catherine's. He wrote a book, The Ladder of Divine Ascent, where he talks about a ladder going from Earth to Heaven. As we do good and holy things, we move up the ladder. As we do bad things, we fall off of the ladder and have to start again. We can learn about how to become closer to God by what St. John says. If we think about moving up the ladder, we can become closer to God, and someday, join him in his holy kingdom of Heaven. God wants us to be like him, and the Ladder shows us how. The more kind things you do, the closer you become to Heaven.
