Troparion Tone 4

The image of God was truly preserved in you, O mother, For you took up the Cross and followed Christ. By so doing, you taught us to disregard the flesh, for it passes away; But to care instead for the soul, since it is immortal. Therefore your spirit, O holy Mother Mary, rejoices with the Angels.

Today's Bible verse is:

What does it mean?

a sacrifice to God is a spirit that is broken; A good heart is one that God will not put to shame.

When Mary was 12, she ran away from home. She spent 17 years partying. She was bad, and although she didn't have much money, when people gave her money, she gave it back. She wasn't trying to be nice; she just wanted to attract as many boys as possible. She was very sinful. One time, a group of people were going to see the cross. The real cross that Jesus was nailed to. She went to see it with them. As soon as she tried to get in to the church, she was stopped by an invisible force. She said it was like a bunch of soldiers were standing there, and blocking her. She then realized why. She had been a very bad person. She went outside, and prayed to the Theotokos. When she was done, she went back in the church, and was ale to go in. the force was gone. After that, she went, and spent the rest of her life in the desert. Zosomas came and fed her everyday, and he also gave her communion. When she died, a lion came, and dug a hole to burry her in. he did, and wrote above her "Bury now the body of humble Mary...Who departed in the month of Fermooten of Egypt, called April of the Romans, on the first day of the month." She is now remembered on April 1st.
